The responsibility of creating an effective, meaningful, safe, and productive summer exchange experience rests with you as the host. SWT visitors require ongoing supervision and should have ample opportunities to ask questions and participate in cultural activities both during and outside of regular duty hours.

Your exchange visitor may contact us if they have any concerns about their health, safety, and/or well-being.
